2024 Budget

On Thursday, February 15, 2024, Council approved Lakeshore's 2024 Budget, **featuring the lowest tax rate increase in the region at 2.97%**. On average, the approved tax rate will add \$54 per year (\$4.50 per month) to the municipal portion of property tax bills.
