Lakeshore Garbage Collection

Please keep your garbage properly secured - tie plastic bags, and make sure metal or plastic lids are fastened tightly. This prevents garbage from littering our neighbourhoods on windy days. Thanks!

- Your garbage will be collected weekly on **Monday, Wednesday or Thursday**. We request that you locate your area on the map below and identify which day your area will receive weekly collection - look for symbols.
- Place **GARBAGE** out for pick up the **NIGHT BEFORE** your scheduled collection day. Do **NOT** place garbage in roadway.
- **Large Items & Furniture:** Will be picked up on your regularly scheduled garbage day (with the exception of white goods). Items such as box springs, mattresses, couches, chairs, and similar materials can be put out on any regular garbage day.
- **NON-COLLECTIBLE Waste:** Waste that is deemed non-collectible includes: Ammunition, animal carcasses, animal waste, appliances, automotive parts, bricks, combustibles, chemical waste, computer equipment, concrete, construction & demolition waste, explosives, industrial waste, liquid waste, medical waste, metal items, pallets, paint products, renovation debris, syringes, televisions, and tires. These items are not garbage and will **NOT** be collected – **check index for Public Drop Off information.**

White Goods

Appliance pick up includes: stoves, fridges, freezers, washers, air conditioners, dryers, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, trash compactors, & microwaves.

Household metal items include: hot water tanks, swing sets, metal sinks, barbecues, metal sheds, mowers, bicycles, garage doors, bathtubs, etc.

This service is **FREE OF CHARGE** for all Lakeshore residents.

All Areas: You must call Windsor Disposal Service Ltd. (WDS) at 519-944-8009 to arrange for this service.

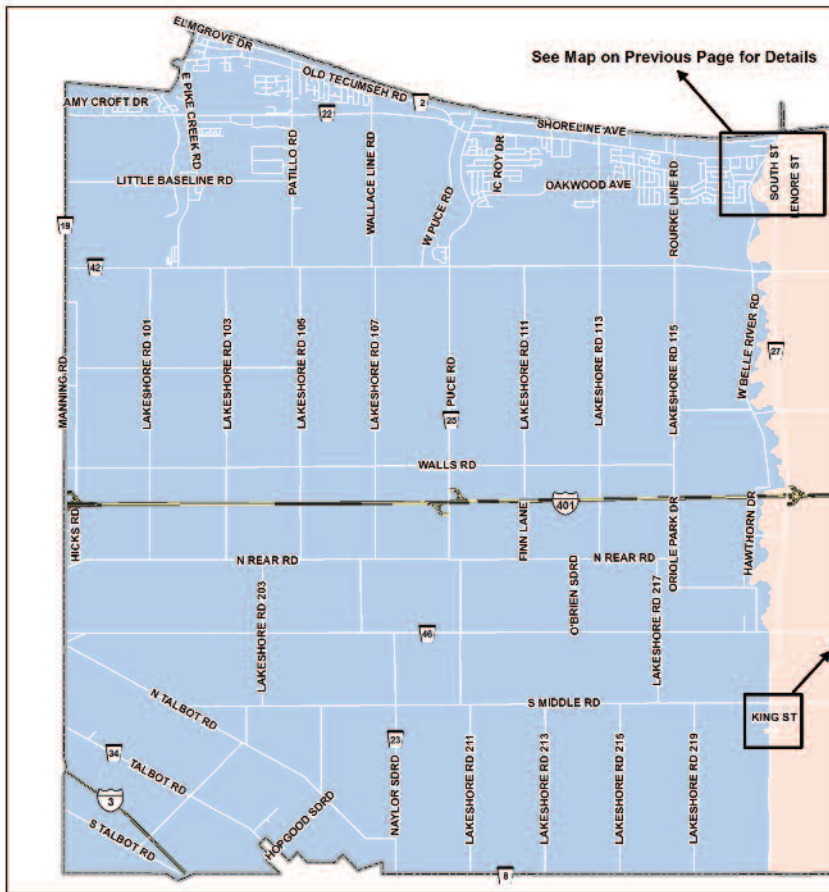
You can drop off white goods, electronics, and televisions at the Public Drop Off Depot (see index). A fee will be charged will be charged for white goods containing a compressor.

The following items are **NOT** considered white goods: furniture, porcelain sinks / toilets (completely disassembled), mattresses, textiles, or miscellaneous garbage. Put out with regular garbage.

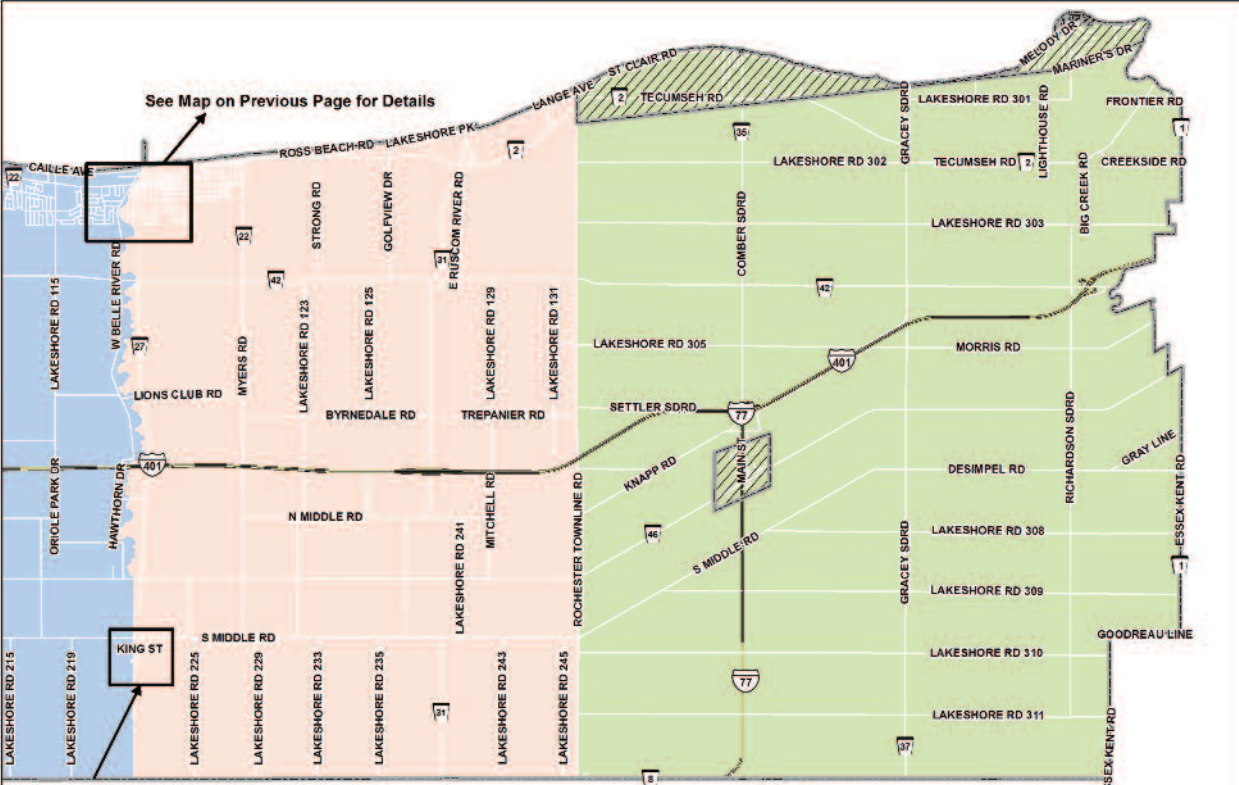

Acceptable Garbage Containers:

Plastic Bags

- **TIED** Commercial grade plastic bags only
- Recommended size: 26" X 36"
- Never put sharp objects in plastic bags



Metal or Plastic Cans

- Maximum 125L / 30 gal. capacity
- Maximum 78 cm/31" tall, 20" diameter
- 2 handles and a water tight lid



Unacceptable Garbage / Containers:

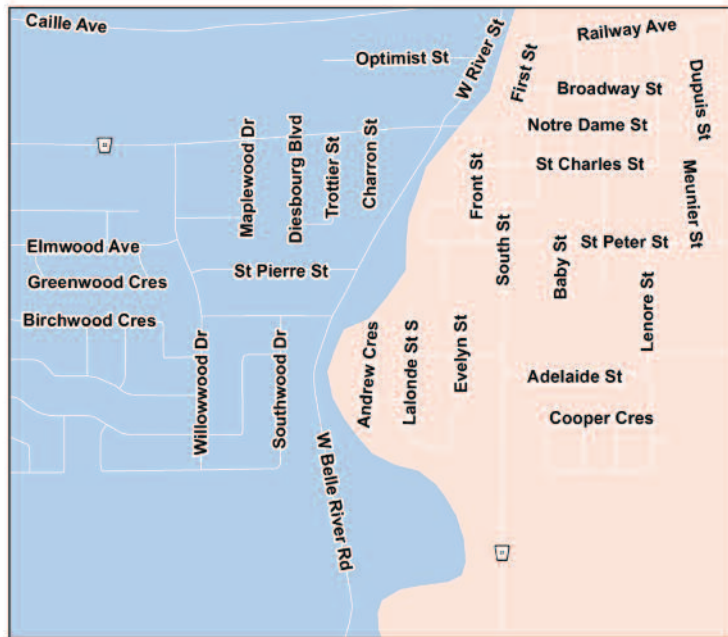
- **Oversized and overweight:** containers (over 20 kg / 45 lbs.)
- **Waste that is deemed non-collectible includes:** COMPUTER EQUIPMENT, TELEVISIONS, explosives, combustible, wet organic waste, liquid waste, animal carcasses, car parts, construction materials, industrial waste, pallets, and tires.



Hydrant Flushing: Hydrant flushing is a normal maintenance procedure and may result in customers experiencing rusty or milky water conditions. Please check when running water and if discoloration occurs, run cold water taps until the water clears. Hydrant flushing may occur between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

All customers should note that flushing of water mains may be required without notification at various times throughout the year in order to ensure water quality. Thanks for your cooperation!

Yard Waste Collection

Basic Collection Requirements:

- All areas will receive **TWO (2) yard waste pick ups per month** indicated by the yard waste bag (symbol). Please **place your yard waste out the NIGHT BEFORE** your scheduled collection day.

Area 1 - begins April 11th
Area 2 - begins April 18th

- If you must place grass clippings out, put them in garbage pails. Do NOT use plastic bags.
- Grass clippings will only be collected from April to November on your scheduled yard waste collection day. **Grass clippings placed out for regular garbage collection will NOT be picked up.**

The **only ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS** for Yard Waste are:

- Paper Yard Waste Bags
- Cardboard Boxes
- Garbage Cans / Pails

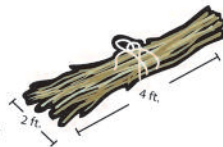


No Plastic Bags for Yard Waste!

Yard Waste Preparation:

- Yard Waste is defined as (grass, leaves, garden trimmings, brush & branches)

- Tree / Hedge Trimmings:**
Cut in 4 ft. lengths (max. diameter 2 ft.) and bundle securely. **Not to exceed 45 lbs.**



Large tree trunks or stumps will NOT be picked up.

- Vegetation / Garden Waste:**
Flowers, vegetable plants and fruit should be put in acceptable containers for collection (remove soil from roots).
- Christmas Trees:**
Remove ornaments, bags and stands. Recycle your tree at one of the designated depots (see January).



← **Look for the Paper Yard Waste Bag (symbol).** It will indicate the date of your Yard Waste Collection Day.



Missed Garbage Collections

Missed collections are upsetting, but there is usually a reason why material was not collected as expected.

To ensure your materials are collected, please ensure they are:

- In acceptable containers
- Out the NIGHT BEFORE your collection day
- Within the weight limit of 20 kg (45 lbs)
- Not hidden behind a vehicle, snow bank, or other obstruction
- Free of prohibited content (e.g. hazardous or construction/renovation waste)

Other reasons for missed collections are:

- Unacceptable containers, i.e. plastic shopping bags
- Not scheduled for collection that particular day
- Non-collectible waste i.e. computer equipment, televisions, renovation debris, animal waste, paint, medical waste, tires, concrete, appliances and metal items.

If an item is not collected for reasons other than the above, please contact the Town of Lakeshore at 519-728-2488. **Please do not leave uncollected material at the curb while you are resolving the problem.**

Disconnecting Downspouts is Easy!

Downspout Disconnection Program

The Town of Lakeshore is asking all homeowners to disconnect non-essential downspouts. A downspout is non-essential if disconnecting it would not create a freeze hazard over walkways or adversely affect neighbouring properties.



Even if your house has never flooded or doesn't have a basement, if your downspouts are directed into the ground, you may be contributing to basement flooding in other homes.

It's easy to disconnect a downspout and financial assistance may be available.

Basement Flooding Subsidy Program

The Town of Lakeshore is offering financial subsidy to:

- Disconnect downspouts from foundation drains;
- Install a back water valve on the internal plumbing system in existing homes;
- Install a sump pump overflow valve to discharge outside to surface (applies to existing sump pumps only);

The Town is now offering mini-camera inspections of sanitary and storm connections to homes **FREE OF CHARGE.**

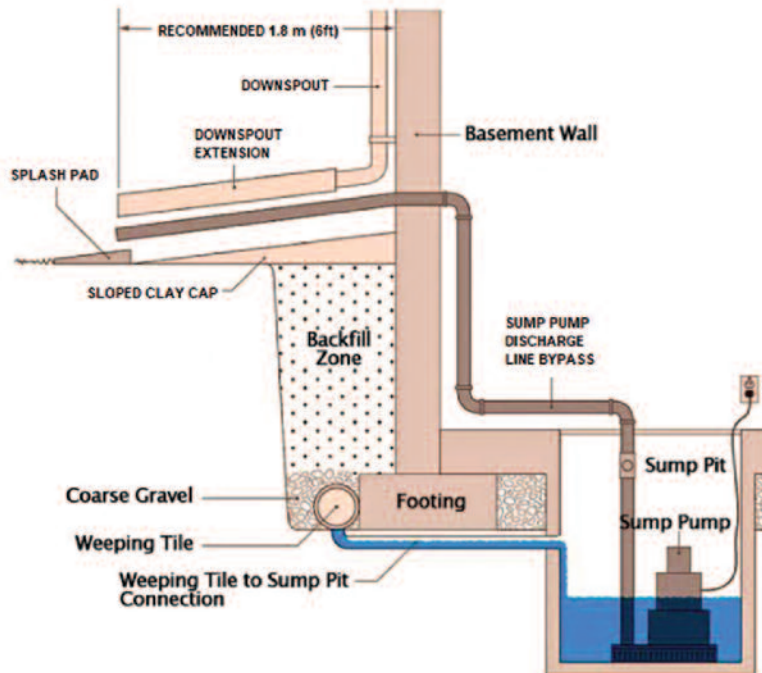

Additional Tips to Reduce the Risk of Flooding

- Ensure ground & pavement slope away from building
- Ensure there are no cracks in storm water piping around the house
- Ensure no cracks or holes in the basement walls or floors that may allow water to enter the basement
- Provide backup power supply to the sump pump

Property Standards!

Property Standard Reminders

- 1. Long grass and or weeds in excess of 8".** Keeping long grass or weeds in excess of 20 cm (8") in height is a violation of the Yard Maintenance Bylaw No. 54-2018.
- 2. Derelict, abandoned or non-plated vehicles.** Any vehicle in a condition which is derelict, dismantled, non-running, un-plated or without up to date validation tags affixed, is not permitted to be stored outside on a property.
- 3. Shedding water on adjacent property.** Every property must have a means of retaining its own storm and surface water so to not adversely affect neighbours.
- 4. Garbage, clutter and debris.** Unsightly accumulations of garbage or debris on a property is prohibited.
- 5. Recreational vehicles (boat, trailer, RV, etc.) stored in driveway or front yard.** Only 2 recreational vehicles are permitted on each property, the vehicle must be parked behind the front face of the house in the rear or side yard.
- 6. Dangerous or dead trees.** Dead trees and any trees with significant dead or damaged portions likely to cause a health and safety risk or damage to any building, must be trimmed or removed. Ownership of a tree is determined by the property where the main trunk is located.



DOG TAGS

Did you know that dog tags help reunite owners with their pets quickly?



Dog owners in the Town of Lakeshore are required to purchase a dog tag for each of their dogs (maximum three dogs per dwelling unit) every year.



To avoid a late penalty, residents are encouraged to purchase their tags by **March 31, 2020**. Fees increase as of April 1st.

- Town Hall (419 Notre Dame, Lakeshore)

NO! Not In Your Red & Blue Box!

These materials are 'unaccepted items' in this program.

Our **two-stream** recycling program is material specific. Recyclable **containers** go in the **Blue Box** and **paper** goes in the **Red Box**.

If you put any of these '**unaccepted items**' in your recycle boxes they become '**contamination**' and cause serious hazards to our workers and major operational issues in our plants.
