## Mayor's Message: 2026 Budget Deliberations

This December, Council and I will gather to deliberate Lakeshore's 2026 Budget. This will be the fourth and final budget of our term, and we continue to prioritize bold and focused leadership to ensure our municipality can overcome today's challenges while preparing for the future.

Our challenges are extensive, aging infrastructure, a booming population, and increased demand for new and existing services.

Throughout our term, we've faced these challenges head on while limiting the impact on taxpayers. We know that times are tight, and every dollar counts. We've received tens of millions of dollars from upper levels of government, including the single largest grant in our history in 2025, and we continue to seek external funding and community partners to help us achieve our goals.

This budget is also the first under Ontario's Strong Mayor

framework. While this legislation gives me additional power to make specific budget decisions, I have opted to only provide Administration with general guidelines.

Budget deliberations are one of our most important decision-making processes, and they deserve a close eye and a team approach. Council and I are dedicated to delivering on that promise.

Together we are Lakeshore.
