Mayor's Message:

Water and Wastewater Master Plan Marks a Time for Action

Earlier this year, Council and I supported the 2024 Water and Wastewater Master Plan, a document that will guide critical water and wastewater infrastructure investments in Lakeshore's communities over the next two decades.

First, I'd like to thank the residents and stakeholders who shared their input during the extensive community consultations that were conducted for the plan. Feedback is incredibly important to ensure strategic documents like this one reflect the needs of our communities.

Unfortunately, what we've learned through this process is that our water and wastewater systems have long been underfunded. This lack of action has brought us to a point where hundreds of millions of dollars' worth of investments are needed to meet both current and future needs.

We know that many residents will be frustrated by the costs outlined in this plan, but inaction is no longer an option and Council and I are united in our duty to protect the environment, keep our drinking water safe, and provide sewer systems that meet remand.

Those measures will reflect the comprehensive approach necessary to tackle a problem of this magnitude. The plan includes investments in preliminary works and detailed designs to ensure projects are ready to be built as soon as funding is made available. We will also be conducting a review of our development charges and water/wastewater rates to ensure they can support the investments outlined in the plan.

Finally, we will seek support from other levels of government, which will be essential to the plan's success. I look forward to meeting with provincial and federal officials to discuss this plan and how it can support the achievement of our shared goals.

Looking ahead, Council will hold 2025 Budget deliberations in January of next year. Those discussions will include projects identified in the Master Plan. Lithium - Ion Battery Safety

The Lakeshore Fire Department is urging residents to exercise caution with lithium-ion batteries following three residential fires caused by battery malfunctions. Common in devices like remote control cars and phones, these batteries can overheat, ignite, or explode when damaged or improperly charged. Here are some safety tips to remember:

- Purchase batteries directly from the product manufacturer.
- Never leave batteries charging unattended and use manufacturer approved chargers.
- Store batteries in fireproof lithium-ion battery bags to reduce fire risk while charging.
- Stop using your device if the battery shows signs of damage such as odor, excessive heat, popping sounds, swelling, or changing colour.
- Damaged batteries should be safely discarded according to local hazardous waste guidelines.

Keep Lakeshore Safe this Winter

Do your part to help keep roads safe for all road users & snowplow operators with these winter weather tips:

- Maintain a safe driving distance from all vehicles, especially snowplows/service vehicles during a snow event. Be cautious, snowplows back up frequently.
- Park vehicles in driveways and off local roads whenever possible. If vehicles are blocking the roadway, Lakeshore staff may ask for vehicles to be moved.
- Keep garbage and recycle bins on your lawn and off the roads. Ensure they are visible from the road.
- Do not shovel snow onto roads and always clear snow off sidewalks in front of your property. Depositing snow on the roadway is an offence under the Highway Traffic Act.
