As summer approaches, backyard pools become a hub of fun for kids, friends, and family. To keep the fun safe, it's important to understand the risks, whether you own or are just visiting a pool. The single most important way to keep everyone safe is to ensure that young children are always supervised in and around the water. Here are some pool safety tips to follow:

- Appoint an adult to actively supervise children near the pool.
- Keep children under five within arm's reach in and around the water.
- Control and restrict access to the pool with a latching gate and enclosed fencing to help prevent potential accidents.
- Enroll your family in swimming lessons to learn essential water safety skills.

Spring Projects Permit Reminder:

If you're planning to build a swimming pool, fence, or deck, a permit application must be submitted prior to the start of construction. Under By-law #39-2018, a permit is required, along with specific height, and material requirements.
